

Highlights of the 2022 National Tribal Water Council and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency - Office of Water Spring Virtual Meeting

The National Tribal Water Council (NTWC) held its spring virtual meeting with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Office of Water on June 7-8, 2022. The NTWC and EPA meet biannually to discuss important current water topics on proposed regulations, water initiatives, tribal consultation and funding opportunities.

Ms. Radhika Fox, EPA Assistant Administrator for Office of Water, provided opening remarks highlighting the current activities and accomplishments of the Office of Water, including the current status of the Tribal Water Action

Plan. The water action plan outlines four priorities of importance to the EPA Office of Water. The four priorities are as follows:

The NTWC Chairman Norton provided an update on the development of the NTWC's Tribal Water Quality

Standards Guidebook. The NTWC is working to finalize

- Promoting robust coordination and meaningful consultation with tribes;
- Strengthening and expanding water governance in Indian Country;
- Increasing infrastructure funding and capacity development for tribal water programs; and
- Honoring federal trust responsibilities and protecting tribal reserved rights related to water resources.

The EPA Office of Water program staff also provided updates on key proposed actions and regulations, such as the draft National Program Guidance, draft GAP Guidance, and Tribal Clean Water Act Section 106 Grant Guidance revisions. A key topic of discussion was the proposed Clean Water Act Section 401 Water Quality

Certification Improvement Rule that includes provisions for tribes to obtain treatment-as-a-state (TAS) status for the section 401 certification program or to act as a neighboring jurisdiction under section 401(a)(2). This is the first time tribes will have this option without first obtaining TAS for water quality standards. Additionally, the EPA Office of Water informed the NTWC about program funding for water and wastewater infrastructure activities funded through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.

The NTWC Chairman Norton provided an update on the development of the NTWC's Tribal Water Quality Standards Guidebook. The NTWC is working to finalize the guidebook in October 2022. In addition, Nancy Schuldt, NTWC Region 5 representative, presented on the Fond du Lac Band's 401(a)(2) public hearing. She shared her tribe's experience with requesting a hearing and the process of opposing the Section 404 permit for the PolyMet mining project.

The biannual meetings offer opportunities for great dialogue between the NTWC and EPA Office of Water. These biannual meeting originally were held in-person, however, since 2020, due to the coronavirus pandemic, the biannual meetings have been held virtually. The NTWC appreciates the EPA Office of Water staff for engaging in meaningful dialogue and support of tribal water programs.

EPA Announces New Drinking Water Health Advisories for PFAS

On June 15, 2022, EPA issued the final health advisories (HAs) for two per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS): 1) hexafluoropropylene oxide (HFPO) dimer acid and its ammonium salt (referred to as "GenX chemicals"); and 2) perfluorobutane sulfonic acid and its potassium salt (PFBS).

EPA also issued interim updated drinking water health advisories for perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA) and perfluorooctane sulfonic acid (PFOS) that replace the advisories issued in 2016. These updated health advisory levels, which are based on new science, will remain in place until EPA establishes a National Primary

EPA Announces Notice of Funding Opportunity Released for Technical Assistance for Treatment Works

Deadline: August 22, 2022

EPA is soliciting applications to provide training and technical assistance to rural, small, and tribal municipalities, publicly owned wastewater treatment works, and decentralized wastewater treatment systems for the prevention, reduction, and elimination of pollution. Eligible activities include training and technical assistance only. Infrastructure construction projects such as repairing water or sewer lines, adding new equipment, or upgrading, retrofitting, or rehabilitating existing equipment are not eligible for funding under this announcement.

NOAA Restoring Tribal Priority Fish Passage Through Barrier Removal Grants

Deadline: August 29, 2022

Up to \$12 million in funding is available under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law to implement fish passage work and build tribal organizational capacity. This funding will support Indian tribes, tribal commissions, and tribal consortia in implementing tribal priority fish passage projects, including organizational capacity building that benefit migratory fish in coastal ecosystems, including the Great Lakes.

In collaboration with NOAA, selected Indian tribes and tribal commission or consortia partners will use these funds to implement barrier removal efforts that benefit tribally-important migratory fish, and to build tribal organizational capacity to participate in developing current and future fish passage projects. Funding will support fisheries and protected resources, while also enhancing community resilience to climate hazards by removing or improving aging infrastructure.

Proposed Changes to the National Allocation of GAP

Deadline: August 2, 2022

EPA initiated consultation and coordination with federally recognized Tribes to receive input on proposed changes to the national allocation of Indian Environmental General Assistance Program (GAP) funds to tribal and intertribal consortia recipients. The proposed changes to the funding allocation formula, if adopted, will take effect for all GAP awards made with FY 2023 funds.

Draft 2022 GAP Guidance

Deadline: August 2, 2022

EPA is initiating consultation and coordination with federally recognized tribes to receive input on the draft 2022 Guidance on the Award and Management of Indian Environmental General Assistance Program Assistance Agreements for Tribes and Intertribal Consortia (2022 GAP Guidance). When final, the 2022 GAP Guidance will replace the 2013 Guidance and will be effective for negotiating and awarding GAP financial assistance agreements.

EPA Proposed Clean Water Act Section 401 Water Quality Certification Improvement Rule

Deadline: August 8, 2022

On June 2, 2022, EPA announced the proposed Clean Water Act Section 401 Water Quality Certification Improvement Rule. The proposal would strengthen the authority of tribes, states, and territories to protect their vital water resources while supporting an efficient, predictable, and workable certification process. EPA held a pre-proposal tribal consultation and coordination period from June 7, 2021 to September 7, 2021. A copy of the pre-proposal tribal consultation summary is included in the proposed rule docket.

The deadline to submit comments on the rule proposal is August 8, 2022. Please submit comments through Docket ID No. EPA-HQ-OW-2022-0128 or use https://www.regulations.gov.
