



Climate Impacts

- Regional climate impacts
- Climate change impacts on tribe (impact assessment)
 - Consider impacts on different sectors, such as water resources, plants and wildlife, infrastructure, human health, cultural sites and resources, etc.
 - Bring traditional knowledge (TK) into planning process

Vulnerability and Risk (assessments)

- <u>Vulnerability</u>: susceptibility to being harmed by climate change impacts—depends on sensitivity to climate and capacity to adapt
- <u>Risk</u>: consider consequences of impact and likelihood that impact will happen

- Review basic assumptions
- Update plan regularly
