



What's the Work Needed for Preparedness or Resilience?

• We know impact on tribal impacts so lets look at tribal needs and support for climate adaptation. If we assume this is the sequence of action.



BIA Support Areas

- Tribes need capacity to address the planning/implementation cycle.
 - Training Available, travel support, access to data.

Funding

- Adaptation Planning
 - Planning
 - Vulnerability Assess.
 - Monitoring (limited)
- Travel support
- Build Training Capacity
 - Regional & program level

Technical Support

- Federal Coordination
- Training-(national sessions)
- Webportal (Links to Science and decision support tools, Traditional Ecological Knowledge (TEK))
- Science
 - 5 tribal scientists at CSCs
 - GIS tech. specialist.










- **FY13/14** focus: strategic planning and capacity building, we couldn't afford detailed many vulnerability assessments.
- **FY15 ADDS:** National training, GIS and digital tools come online, and Scientists come on late in the FY.
- FY16: (if funded) We will greatly expand the vulnerability assessments, enabling program level planning, leading to implementation actions with program funds.



Climate Program Funding: Opportunity & History

- FY14/15-\$8 million adaptation, \$2 million
- Current Available Funding RFP DUE April 24th
 - Oceans &Coastal (FY14 & FY15=\$4million)
 - Adaptation (FY15 & unspent FY14=\$4 million +)
 - Youth-pending announcement (FY14 +15= \$2 million)
 - FY14 Funding History-\$10 million in Proposals
 - \$2.5 million in awards distributed -to date.
 - FY13 \$640k in awards.



Ocean and Coastal

- Travel support- participation in Regional
 Planning Bodies (and coordinated planning)
- Funding- planning, including emergency management infrastructure, and climate.
